# TOUCHING MORE LIVES - WORK OF SANKALP SOCIETY

Sankalp Society in India has been working for children from marginalized groups since 2007. The key target group of the all projects undertaken by Sankalp is children from lower socio-economic groups, who need support in learning. The children come

from poor families and have no home support in education as the parents are largely uneducated.

IASE Volunteers and GIVING Funds helped to provide supplies and support to make this happen. IASE has been closely associated with Sankalp in all projects ranging from construction of girls toilets to initiating skill training in high school girls to supporting ICT project for the visually impaired.

In 2018 Sankalp initiated new projects and initiatives with support from IASE. Sankalp currently (since March 2018) works in urban slums located in South Delhi reaching out to 150 children.

### **Programs and Reach:**

- Running a **preschoo**l for the underprivileged children covering 25 children
- Providing **free education and snacks** to 90 underprivileged children
- **Skill training** to young women and girls from urban slums, covering 15 women
- **Remedial coaching** for slow learners covering 20 children.



# The Centres have been opened with the following objectives:

- Holistic development of children from marginalized sections of society
- Create awareness in the local community on the importance of education, especially to girls and young children
- Facilitate access, enrollment and retention in mainstream schools

• Empower parents through regular workshops and PTMs.

The main activities in these Centres include:

- Comprehensive Assessment
- The teaching of school syllabus
- Provision of free snacks
- Documentation of each child's progress
- Educational tours
- Birthday celebration at the Centres
- Exposure to extra-curricular activities
- Celebration of special days, events and festivals
- Computer Training
- Parent Teacher Meetings at the quarterly level
- Free English speaking
- Volunteer visits.



Sankalp has been bestowed upon with two Awards. These are the Double Helical National Health Award in 2018 and Leadership in Education Award in 2019 bestowed upon by New Delhi Institute of Management.

Till now, Sankalp has reached out to 2298 children and young women through its various initiatives. The aim is to help children get quality education so that they could lead meaningful, fuller and productive lives. It is hoped that Sankalp will touch

more lives and continue to empower children through education with continued support from IASE.





Children's Day Celebration at Don Bosco From Children's Day Newsletter

The Don Bosco Snehabhavan is a Child Care Institution that has been functioning for over 45 years, and has seven other orphanages in the region. They have been celebrating the children's day, every year in the month of November, since 2001. They host a wide variety of events including competitions, street plays, and other activities, among which this event is the most celebrated. On this day, several games and cultural events were conducted during event where children, especially from the underprivileged and poorer sections of the society who attend government schools participated. This was one of the most awaited events for the children in South Kochi, as children from all around

the Southern region of Kochi eagerly participated. They were encouraged to take part in a wide variety of games and activities.

The Don Bosco Snehabhavan, Palluruthy hosted its 18th Children's Day program on the 9th of November 2019 along with the District Legal Services department and Childline Kochi. The program also commemorated the 30th anniversary of the United Nations Child Rights Commission. Over 1000 children from South Kochi participated at the function. The event aimed to prevent all kinds of abuse towards children, and to develop a child friendly society. The theme of the event was "My Childhood: My Responsibility", and its focus was on making the children aware of their responsibilities, as they enjoy their rights.

More than 1000 children and 160 inmates of the Don Bosco Snehabhavan, from the age of six to thirteen participated in the event. The function was inaugurated by the Kochi Mayor, Mrs. Soumini Jain. Headed by the Don Bosco Snehabhavan Executive Director Rev.Fr. Varghese Pyanadath, Kerala Child Rights Commission member, Mr. M.P. Antony, and Ernakulam District Childline Director Rev. Fr. Jenson Variyath, a team of 100 volunteers and staff from other offices of Childline in Kerala were enlisted to help in the "My Childhood: My Responsibility" campaigns.
