Call for IASE Board Officers Nominations 2017-2019

Nominations are being accepted from now until December 1st, 2016. The following positions are open:

- 1. President-Elect, 1 to be elected for two-year term
- 2. Secretary, 1 to be elected for two-year term
- 3. Treasurer, 1 to be elected for two-year term
- 4. Member-at-Large, 3 to be elected for two-year terms

Descriptions of the roles and responsibilities for each of the above positions are in IASE's constitution and by-laws which can be found at www/iase/.org. The Constitution states that the board shall be comprised of a minimum representation of 3 countries to reflect the international focus of the organization.

Criteria for application include a valid IASE membership and prior experience with IASE (e.g., committee chair/work, volunteer service and/ or an elected position). Board members are not paid a salary and must attend meetings at their own voluntary expense.

If you are interested in volunteering your time and expertise, send a letter of intent and a short (one page) resume to Marg Csapo, IASE Nominations Chair. These documents can be emailed to margcsapo@shaw.ca or postal mailed to Marg Csapo, 3483 W. 18th Ave., Vancouver, CANADA BC V65 1A8.

The committee will review all nominations and forward their recommendations to the Board for ballot approval. The voting ballot will be included in the February newsletter sent to all paid IASE members. According to the IASE's Constitution, no board member may serve more than two consecutive two-year terms in the same office.

Making Hope Happen in Vietnam

It has been an inspiration to see how the professional staffs of Dean Nga at Ho Chi Minh City University, Department of Special Education, and Dr. Giang at Santa Maria Clinic are making hope happen in Vietnam. Their dreams of developing and providing an appropriate education for their children with disabilities is slowly beginning to become a reality. The passion and dedication they have shown collectively is building the foundation for an appropriate and comprehensive functional training meeting the educational needs of children with disabilities in Vietnam.

After our initial meetings in the summer of 2015, I had the privilege of being asked back to Vietnam for a training of the BASICS3 Curriculum Framework. Dean Nga and Dr. Giang were interested in a functional curriculum framework based on the training of individual levels of performance leading to greater independent skills in the community, for individuals with moderate/severe disabilities and autism.

The first training was held in December of 2015. It was a very successful training and it was a pleasure to once again work together with professionals who have so much passion and dedication in their pursuit to develop and provide the most appropriate education for children with disabilities. After the completion of the December training, the HCMC University Academic Committee discussed and decided that the BASICS3, with appropriate changes to meet the needs of the Vietnamese culture, would best meet their need for a curriculum framework and requested a follow up workshop in the summer of 2016.

This summer, IASE provided much needed books and materials which have greatly enhanced their educational resources and gave them useful educational toys not found in Vietnam. At the summer workshop, the staffs of HCMC University Special Education Department and Santa Maria Clinic both worked on putting the curriculum framework and assessment into practice, developing IEP's and culminating in lesson planning and instruction. At the completion of the workshop, Action Plans were written for the upcoming year and a follow up workshop is planned for the summer of 2017 to review, discuss and continue the development of a functional curriculum that best meets the needs of children in Vietnam.

I look forward to returning to Vietnam next summer and work together again with the dedicated and passionate professionals at HCMC University and Santa Maria Clinic. It has been through their sincere efforts and determination that much progress has been made toward the development of educational practices that will best meet the needs of their children with disabilities. Our colleagues are definitely making hope happen in Vietnam and they are moving closer toward meeting their goals.


Official Opening of the Mwayi Trust Vocational College By Mary Gale Budzisz

July 16, 2016 is a date to remember and in the words of the International Association of Special Education (IASE) Founder Marg Csapo it was "A Dream come true event! It was not long ago that we were sorting bricks and now a beautiful building stands facing the rock outcroppings in the Rift Valley, ready to receive students, including those with disabilities who might never have gone to school before! It shows that IASE's assistance was appreciated and led to a concrete example of what volunteer help at the grass roots level can do to make changes in the lives of future students. Wonderful team work!"

Pastor James Mbewe opened the celebration with a prayer and thanks to all who contributed to create the vocational college. The motto of Mwayi Trust, "Joining hands, opening doors," was in action throughout the day. Local dignitaries gave speeches and the Peer Educators entertained with their creative songs, dances and drama presentations. Food was shared with the 200 in attendance and the local music encouraged visitors to join in the celebratory dancing.

Everyone got to visit the new building and they were amazed at what they saw. A real library with books, desks and chairs was highly praised. The kitchen which is being adopted and furnished by the IASE caught all by surprise...with three new electric stoves, a new gas stove, a huge new refrigerator and a large microwave. The stainless steel counter tops are ready for students to start making bread and other goodies. An en suite will be ready with a bed, linens, and a private bathroom so that students can begin to learn skills to prepare for jobs in the housekeeping/hotel and hospitality industry. The carpentry area and the tailoring classrooms are awaiting promises from the Ministry of Labor to send equipment for teaching classes. The computer and IT classroom will also be fully equipped soon.

To prepare for the Official Opening members of the IASE Board and Committees traveled to Blantyre to help with various tasks. With the help of some local members many windows were scraped and cleaned, floors were washed, tables cleaned, books shelved, and preparations for the big day were completed. Two huge marques arose from the dust on Opening Day...and the throngs of local community members filled them.

IASE Secretary Beatrice Adera stated that, "Vocational training programs offer a great alternative to young adults with or without disabilities who have preference for hands-on training or those who do not have the chance to pursue further education at the university level. It is worth noting that the graduates from the vocational training college will become resources to their local community and in turn contribute to the overall development of their country. Malawi." Roni Chavez, IASE Member-at-Large, said that she feels that IASE members should visit our Volunteer Service Project sites even once to see what we have given and feel the soul of IASE in action.

Mwayi Trust was established in 2009 within the Traditional Area (TA) of Kunthembwe in Chileka, Blantyre Rural by a group of community members who believe in the power of the community working together to provide opportunities for the children and youth to develop skills, self-worth and improve their quality of life. The motto truly highlights the core values of collaboration, capacity development and empowerment. Those who have contributed their time and funds have enabled Mwayi Trust to assist hundreds of children. With more support and donations this vocational college endeavor will broaden the base of support for the local and neighboring communities.

Karen Nave, IASE Membership Chair, sums up her experience: "Sandra Trevethan, Mwayi Trust CEO, is a woman with vision and a grass roots grasp of what is important and needed in the Mwayi Trust. She recognized the need for a Homework Centre Program and did it. She saw that there was a need for vocational training and did the impossible. Five years ago, when I was first in Malawi, she stopped and pointed outside her car. I saw a bare hill and a small stack of bricks that could maybe make a barbeque pit. Sandra saw the potential for a vocational center. And five years later, viola...a real live beautiful building near completion...a reality! I am very proud of the local communities for their support, Sandra for doggedly pursuing her vision and IASE for its assistance, monetarily and otherwise. I knew I had to return to Malawi to be a part of the celebration. It was truly a privilege to be a part of this mindboggling experience."

Dear IASE members,


