The conference theme is *Supporting Inclusion of Persons with Disabilities across the Lifespan.* Proposals are due by October 1 (https://www.iase.org/conference). We look forward to welcoming you in the heart of Europe to share finding and accomplishments from your work, learn from colleagues, make new friends, and absorb some of the beauty of my native country.

IASE conference planning committee, together with the Czech local conference committee, have been working on the conference details, including presentation spaces, housing options, site visits, local entertainment, etc. The Czech special education system has a lot to offer to researchers, practitioners, and family members from other countries, but it is also ready to accept new ideas for improvement. One of the key areas of focus of the conference this time is the transition of youth with disabilities from school to living in the community as adults, including transition to employment and independent housing. While people with disabilities may live in many different countries and cultures, as most of us, they go through a transition period from childhood to adulthood that can be stressful and otherwise challenging. It is a time that we develop our identities and values going forward. I am looking forward to learning how this period is addressed for young adults and adults in different contexts.

PROPOSAL SUBMISSION GUIDELINES AND CRITERIA

The IASE conference planning committee cordially invites all interested parties to submit presentation proposals.

Please review all submission criteria below and submit the proposal presentation form by **October 1, 2023**. Proposals are limited to 2 per presenter – 1 as a primary proposer and the 1 as a copresenter. Incomplete submissions will not be considered. *Proposals are to be submitted via the IASE website* (https://iase.org/conference). Contact Dr. Kalynn Pistorio at pistorio_kalynn@columbusstate.edu with questions about proposals.

All presenters will be required to pay their registration fees by **May 1, 2024**, to be included in the conference program.

IMPORTANT TIMELINES

Oct. 1, 2023: Deadline for submission of proposals **Dec. 1, 2023**: Notification of acceptance of proposal

Feb. 15, 2024: Conference proceedings due **May 1, 2024**: Early special rates registration fees end

After May 2, 2024: Late conference fees May 1, 2024: All presenters must be registered for conference

TYPES OF SESSIONS OFFERED

Three presentation formats are available for session selection. Select the format that best fits the content and learner outcomes of your proposal from those listed below. Due to limited program slots, the Program Chair may determine it necessary to assign your session a format or length of time different from the one you select.

Lecture: 60 and 30 minutes for individuals to present material about a specific topic. Interaction in this format is typically limited to questions and answers.

Multiple Presentation Panel: Sessions in which 2 or more presenters are given approximately 20 minutes each to present their papers on a common topic, followed by 15 minutes of dialogue led by a discussant. The Program Co-Chairs will group and assign proposals to these sessions. *Format:* A multiple presentation provides an opportunity to examine specific research issues, problems, or topics from a variety of perspectives. This would provide panel discussion format targeted at a clearly delineated research issue or idea. It may also provide interaction within the group.

Round Table and Poster Sessions: 30-minute sessions which visually present a research study, program or project and provide interaction with the participants. **Format**: Round table sessions are designed for participants to interact with a presenter(s) in a small- group setting about a topic. Presenters prepare a handout for attendees to help them with understanding of projects/concepts. Attendees move between different stations of interest. Poster sessions are designed to foster maximum interaction with the audience. There will be multiple poster sessions assigned to each time slot. Attendees will share conversations and interact with a specific poster in round table discussion. Poster session presenters must: (1) prepare a poster exhibit of high quality that can stand alone in conveying information, and (2) attend the entire poster session and address questions from attendees.

Acceptance of Another Session Type: If you are willing to accept another session format, please check the appropriate box.

Acceptance of an Alternative Session Length: If

you are willing to accept a session of a different length, e.g., 30 minutes, instead of 1 hour, please check the appropriate box.

Audio Visual: Each room at the conference site is equipped with a projection system and a screen.

Number of Presenters Including Proposer:

Indicate the total number of presenters who will be participating in the presentation. **Note**: The number of presenters must be appropriate for the length of the session (e.g., a poster session or a 1hour lecture should include no more than 4 presenters). Main presenter is allowed for one presentation. List all presenters.

Selection Criteria

The Program Chair will select proposals based on the following criteria: (A) Importance of the Topic to the Field (B) Usefulness to Practitioners (C) Relevance to Learners, Families, and/or Educators of Diverse Groups

Those whose proposal will be accepted for the conference will also be invited to submit a paper based on their proposal that will be published in the IASE 2024 Conference Proceedings.

In my capacity as one of the IASE Co-President Elect and member of the conference committee, I have been busy corresponding with various US state and national organizations that represent related services professionals regarding our 18th Biennial Conference in Pilsen, the Czech Republic from June 28th thru July 1, 2024 with preconference site visits on the 27th. The conference theme is "Supporting Inclusion of Persons with Disabilities Across the Lifespan" and is in partnership with the University of West Bohemia.

The national organizations that were contacted were the National Association of School Psychologists (NASP), the School Social Work Association of America (SSWAA), the National Association of School Nurses (NASN), the American School Counselor Association (ASCA) and the National Alliance of Specialized Instructional Support Personnel (NASISP).

In my home state of California, the following state organizations were contacted, the California Association of School Psychologists (CASP), the California Association of School Social Workers (CASSW), the California School Nurses Organization (CSNO) and the California Association of School Counselors (CASC). I have received responses from several of these organizations and will continue to correspond and promote our conference and opportunities within IASE for their members.

In addition, in my capacity as the Co-President Elect (Interim), I will participate in the IASE conference committee and attended our recent Zoom meeting on August 19. For that meeting, I reviewed several conference documents for publication: the *Exhibitor, Sponsorship and Advertising Information* packet and the *Conference Registration Form*.

CALL FOR IASE BOARD NOMINATIONS 2024-2026 Nominations

We are currently seeking proposals for the 2026 IASE Conference site. We welcome proposals for a venue site that meet the requirements listed below:

- Located in a city with an international airport and situated in a reasonably close proximity to hotels. In addition, there should be available low cost sleeping rooms (e.g., dorms) for individuals who prefer to stay on the university campus.
- Provide adequate meeting space with 12-15 meeting rooms that would accommodate 25-35 persons, a large meeting space (to accommodate 400 people) for general plenary session and space for registration, exhibits, and poster sessions.
- Provide needed equipment (e.g., overheads, and/or LCD projectors, screens, laptops, easels).
- Have food services available at/near venue site.
- Be willing to promote the conference in the region/country and designate a minimum of 5-6 people to serve on a Local Planning Committee to work with the IASE Planning Committee on conference needs (e.g., printing a program).
- Be willing to provide guidance to the IASE Planning Committee about tours, school visits, venue for Gala Dinner, and more.
- Have available low cost sleeping rooms (e.g., dorms) for individuals who seek/prefer to stay on the university campus.
- Be able and willing to accept registrations from your own country. This would include accepting the registrations and funds, and maintaining appropriate records for accounting purposes.

If you are interested in hosting the 2026 IASE Conference, please submit a proposal to IASE addressing all the information listed above. **All proposals should be forwarded to our IASE President.** Your proposal should be sent to Dr. Renata Ticha, at <u>tich0018@umn.edu</u> by **January 20, 2024.** The proposals will be reviewed by our Site Selection Committee. The recommended site(s) will be forwarded to the IASE Board for final selection at the spring 2024 Board Meeting. **The final site will be announced at our 18th Biennial Conference in the Czech Republic.**



Call for IASE Board Officers Nominations 2024-2026 Nominations are being accepted from now until January 1st, 2024. The following positions are open:

- 1. President-Elect, 1 to be elected for two-year term
- 2. Secretary, 1 to be elected for two-year term
- 3. Treasurer, 1 to be elected for two-year term

Descriptions of the roles and responsibilities for each of the above positions are in IASE's constitution and by-laws which can be found at <u>http://iase/.org</u>. The Constitution states that the board shall be comprised of a minimum representation of 3 countries to reflect the international focus of the organization.

Criteria for application include a valid IASE membership and prior experience with IASE (e.g., committee chair/work, volunteer service and/ or an elected position). Board members are not paid a salary and must attend meetings at their own voluntary expense.


