

7. Address: Provide the address where you would like the invitation letter to be sent, if applicable.

8. Purpose of Visit: Briefly mention your purpose for attending the conference (e.g., presenter, attendee, etc.).

9. Dates of Stay: Include the dates for which you plan to be in the country for the conference.

10. Any Additional Details: If there are any specific details or formats required by your local embassy or consulate, please let us know. Dear IASE 2024 Delegates,

Should you wish to participate in our pre-conference site visits, below you will find a list of suggested onsite settings, including schools or social services settings, provided within the city of Pilsen or nearby.

We have organized nine different site visit options, each with the capacity of 5 people max and each named by a different color for better orientation. Participants will gather at a pre-arranged meeting point, the well-known and still glorified Memorial called "Thank you America," (https://cs.wikipedia.org/wiki/Díky, Ameriko!#/map/ 0) located at Americká Street, on behalf of those who liberated our city in 1945. Your site visit guide, holding a ticket matching the color of your visit, will meet you there.

The first visit is scheduled for approximately 8:30 – 11:30. Following the visit, there will be a lunch break (11:30 – 12:30), provisionally scheduled at one of our well-known social enterprises – Café Restaurant (https://kacaba.cz Prokopova 17, 301 00, Plzeň).



Here, young people with intellectual disabilities will serve you. They acquired

their first social and vocational skills here, which they then applied within the open labor market. Please note that you will be responsible for paying for your lunch (best to have local currency for both) as well as a ticket for public transportation. Your guide will assist you.

The second visit is scheduled for the early afternoon, approximately from 1:00 pm - 3:30 pm, depending on the location of the site and the nature of the support provided to the clientele. SPJ Sadhana School, Mumbai, India Empowering Persons with Special Needs 1973-2023

The month of August 2023 began with the first event for the Golden Jubilee Celebrations of SPJ Sadhana School, the Inauguration of the Memory Wall. The unveiling of the Memory Wall revealed the emerging story of 50 years of the school. An important aspect was the Golden Jubilee Logo, which celebrates the milestone of 50 years and symbolizes the promise to continue the journey onwards.



SPJ Sadhana School is a special school dedicated to the holistic development of children and young adults with varied neurodivergent needs. Located in the scenic campus of Sophia College in Mumbai, the school is a renowned institution working in the field for the past fifty years.

The school has a dedicated mission to empower the students with Special Educational Needs, to develop cognitively, kinaesthetically, socially, emotionally, behaviourally and vocationally, with the ultimate goal to make them independent and productive members of society.

The journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step. And the school has been supported

with the compassion and collaboration of numerous large-hearted and dedicated persons, through the management, staff, parents, donors and students.

SPJ Sadhana School's Journey

In the 1960's, Ms Mira Parikh, the Principal of Tinkerbell School, along with a few parents of children with special needs, started a Special Unit of Education, within the school. It was located at Kemps Corner, near the flyover. The founder members included Mrs. Durga Jain, mother of Vasudha; Lady Sonoo Jeejeebhoy, mother of Geeta; and Mrs. Gladys Kothawala, who was later the founder member of AWMH.

When the school was asked to relocate, these parents approached Sr. Mary Braganza at Sophia College, who open heartedly housed the students. The first classrooms were in the basement of the college. The principal of this small unit was Sr. Ormesher from 1970 to 1972. The goals of education included developing communication, independence and training in basic educational subjects. Parental involvement was imperative so as to provide them guidance on how to work with the children at home. Mrs Din Guha was the Principal from 1972 to 1973.

In 1971, the Province decided to take the school under their wing and drew up an agreement to place it under SHEWI (Society for Higher Education of Women in India) in March 1973.

Thus SPJ Sadhana School was born owing to the missionary zeal of the Sisters of Sacred Heart and the philanthropic gesture of the Shreyans Prasad Jain Trust.

SPJ Sadhana School's Journey Continued.....

The word 'sadhana' implied 'dedicated work and spiritual discipline', since Mrs Durga Jain believed that she had been entrusted by God to look after her special child. Mrs. Vijaya Ullal became the Principal and the school grew in terms of the services that it provided. For Sophia College, the school also served as a practical work centre for the Psychology Department.

In 1977, Mrs. Rukmini Krishnaswamy became the principal. Under her leadership, and the guidance provided by Sr. Mary Braganza, Sr. Charlotte Bastion and Sr Geradette Phillips, the student strength of the school grew from 16 to 48.

Besides the education, it was important to provide vocational training to the students. Hence, in the 1980's, the family of a student, Srinivas Ramanujan (Bossie), sponsored the development of the Vocational Section, on the top floor of the Arts building of the college. The polytechnic courses included were Office Skills, Art department and a Fast Food Department. The first batch of students graduated in 1990, and that was when Mrs Krishnaswamy retired.

In 1990, Sr Eileen Gaitonde took over as the principal, and steered the school forward until her retirement in 2017. She was dynamically supported by Dr Radhike Khanna, who served as the vice principal from 1995 to 2017. In 1991, through another generous endowment from Mrs. Esther D'Souza, a new building came up on the campus, and was named Dr Rozendo Ribeiro Children's Complex, after her father. Here, the school was housed on the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} floor.

With the additional space the school's processes and services expanded to serve the

students on a broader spectrum. These included the following classes and departments: The Intensive Therapy Unit (ITU), Pre-Nursery, Nursery, Transition, juniors, Pre Vocational, General Vocational, Office Skills, Hospitality and Catering, Art and Craft and Home Skills along with a psychologist, an occupational therapist for sensory integration, a speech therapist, the use of Makaton and computer training. Students of the vocational courses were introduced to internships, and graduation ceremonies were conducted every five years. In 2008, the school was even ISO certified, making the systems and processes of the school match international standards. However, more space was required, to provide more enhanced services, to empower more children and young adults with neuro-divergent needs.

Thus in 2011, with Sr. Gaitonde's vision, Dr. Radhike Khanna's received from the Navajbai Ratan Tata Trust, two more floors were added to the building.

The school structure now included the Formative Years with grades I to IV, the Intermediate Level including the Skills Enhancement Class and the Pre Vocational Class, and the five-year Vocational Training Courses including Hospitality and Catering Department, the Office Procedures Course, the Visual Arts and Crafts Department and the Work Words Skills Department (later renamed as Wood Arts and Handicrafts Department).

The topmost floor was dedicated entirely to the provision of multiple therapies that supported the teaching and vocational training programs of the school. It was called Enhanced Learning Centre, and in 2020 was renamed as Enhanced Intervention Centre. Currently the multitherapy centre includes Arts Based Therapy, Art and Craft, Counselling and Therapy, Dance Movement Therapy, Department of Eclectic Therapy, Hydrotherapy, Music Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Play Therapy, Snoezelen, Speech Therapy, Sports training and Yoga.

In 2016, Sr Pratibha Pinto was appointed as the School Administrator and in 2018; Ms Fionika Sanghvi became the Principal of the school. Under their leadership, the school is now recognised as a model school working ceaselessly to make the students creative, responsible and productive members of society. Today the Principal Fionika Sanghvi leaves us with.....

"Empowering the special needs students leads to their growth. Every student who has reached the door of the school climbs its steps and runs through the corridor. We have been able to empower the students to a level of advocating INCLUSION.

And, so, this is the theme of the Golden Jubilee of SPJ Sadhana School Inclusion."

IASE MEMBER HIGHLIGHTS Wilfred Elias Serikali Member for 5 years

One of the strengths of IASE is the individuals who represent our IASE Family. This month we will be highlighting Wilfred Elias Serikali from Tanzania & Dung Doan from Vietnam

Wilfred Elias Serikali, is a Tanzanian from Musoma located in the Mara region. In 2023 he was hired as the first special education teacher at Musoma Technical Secondary School which is a public school with students with disabilities who are deaf, physically impaired, visually impaired, intellectually impaired, and albinism. He was allocated to teach deaf students where he was able to establish a sign language club that opened communication between students and their hearing peers; it also became a great platform for producing sign language interpreters at the school.

In September 2023, Wilfred convinced his fellow teachers in town to establish an NGO for the creation of a union of special education teachers to gain greater strength and a voice to help students with special needs in more life skills including education, economics, and leadership. Finally, on December 2024 we were able to register an NGO called Organization of Special Needs Education Teachers (OSNET). We started with 8 members, later 10 others joined and now the NGO has 230 members where 96% are special education teachers. For all that time until now, he continues to be the Chairman of OSNET.

Through OSNET, we have been able to reach 89 schools, (51 primary and 38 secondary) with more than 30,000 students and 442 teachers. Also, we have been able to reach 16 of the 26 regions in mainland Tanzania. We do empowerment activities, advocacy for change, and lobbying.

Our biggest goal by the year 2025 is to be able to reach 120 schools, 1000 teachers, and 50,000 students in all 25 regions of Tanzania. OSNET has become a wide network to connect the ideas of special teachers who have been scattered in different corners of Tanzania for a long time. It has allowed them to exchange knowledge, linking and learning together to improve inclusive education in the country.

Our vision for the year 2024 is to start the Yearly National Summit of the Special Education Conference as it is done in IASE. This conference will bring together important educational decisionstakeholders from levels policymakers. making including government officials, education special teachers, school principals, out-of-service teachers, and others who will be included in one platform to evaluate the progress of inclusive education in the country. Also, it will open the door for friends of inclusive education to discuss successes and make suggestions for improvement for the betterment of young students with special needs in the country. Finally, each year the summit will develop a practical guidebook that

can be implemented by every educator in inclusive schools.

IASE MEMBER HIGHLIGHTS Dung Doan Member for 2 years

Dung Doan from HCMC Vietnam is the founder and director of the Potential Development Center of Psychological and Speech - Language Therapies. After working with children with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) for 2 years, he had an opportunity to participate in a 2-year Speech - Language Pathology program. This was a partnership program between Pham Ngoc Thach University of Medicine, University of Newcastle (Australia), Ho Chi Minh City Otolaryngology Hospital and Trinh Foundation – Australia.

In 2016, to support more families with children with ASD, he decided to open Potential Development Center of Psychological and Speech - Language Therapies. The main center is located at 47/4 Nguyen Cuu Van Street, Binh Thanh District, HCMC. In 2018, he moved the main center to 18/29 Nguyen Cuu Van Street, Binh Thanh District and opened three more branches in the area.

The 4 campuses include 30 intervention rooms, 9 sensory and playrooms, 1 calming room and 2 enhanced physical exercise rooms. He currently has 23 staff who have graduated with Bachelor's Degrees in Psychology, Speech Language Pathology or Social Work.

The early intervention center focuses on 1: 1 individual intervention. Our Potential Development Center of Psychological and Speech - Language Therapies uses a family centered approach toward learning. We acknowledge the importance of the family presence and understanding in their children's daily lives. So we create an environment where parents and caregivers are encouraged to work closely with specialists in the child's intervention and development process. Intervention goals are individualized to suit each child's abilities, while emphasizing the close connection between our specialists and families. In addition, multidisciplinary coordination is also highlighted to target specific interventions in the child's overall development.

Since our center mainly is for early intervention with 1:1 section. Our Basics3 classes are for a small group of 3 - 8 students depending on the students' age and development. One class serves as a PREP PROGRAM for children starting elementary school and the other class is for students who need more independent skills in daily life.

For children intending to go to elementary school, students can take the 1:1 section and Basics3 class simultaneously which usually takes around 6 months to 1 year before entering the elementary school classes.

We are currently seeking proposals for the 2026 IASE Conference site. We welcome proposals for a venue site that meet the requirements listed below:

- Located in a city with an international airport and situated in reasonable proximity to hotels. In addition, there should be available low-cost sleeping rooms (e.g., dorms) for individuals who prefer to stay on the university campus.
- Provide adequate meeting space with 12-15 meeting rooms that would accommodate 25-35 persons, a large meeting space (to accommodate 400 people) for general plenary sessions, and space for registration, exhibits, and poster sessions.
- Provide needed equipment (e.g., overheads, and/or LCD projectors, screens, laptops, easels).
- Have food services available at/near venue site.

Be willing to promote the conference in the region/country and designate a

- Planning Committee to work with the IASE Planning Committee on conference needs (e.g., printing a program).
- Be willing to provide guidance to the IASE Planning Committee about tours, school visits, venue for Gala Dinner, and more.
- Have available low cost sleeping rooms (e.g., dorms) for individuals who seek/prefer to stay on the university campus.
- Be able and willing to accept registrations from your own country. This would include accepting the registrations and funds and maintaining appropriate records for accounting purposes.

If you are interested in hosting the 2026 IASE Conference, please submit a proposal to IASE addressing all the information listed above. **All proposals should be forwarded to our IASE** **President.** Your proposal should be sent to Dr. Renata Ticha, at <u>tich0018@umn.edu</u> by **March 20, 2024.** The proposals will be reviewed by our Site Selection Committee. The recommended site(s) will be forwarded to the IASE Board for final selection at the spring 2024 Board Meeting. **The final site will be announced at our 18th Biennial Conference in the Czech Republic.**
