Engagement, Collaboration and Reflections from our 18th Biennial Conference in the Czech Republic

The 18th Biennial conference gave delegates a chance to exchange their valuable knowledge and experience regarding disability and education from different perspectives. Esteemed scholars and experienced practitioners engaged with participants to share their current work, highlight preferred resources, facilitate breakout sessions, and deliberate on their newest ideas in the field. Furthermore, the conference drew over 200 participants from 34 countries worldwide.

Moreover, in partnership with the University of West Bohemia, IASE brought together a wide range of research and case studies from around the globe in simultaneous sessions. The event also offered numerous networking and publishing opportunities, providing a rich and meaningful platform for engagement.

This year's conference was highlighted by the outstanding keynote speakers who delivered engaging speeches at both the Opening and Closing Plenaries. Furthermore, a number of presenters in our breakout sessions were individuals with intellectual disabilities, offering insightful and inspiring addresses, presentations, and artwork that brought a new perspective to current issues and the conference's main theme of 'Supporting Inclusion of Persons with Disabilities Across The Life Span.'



Collaboration



Supporting Inclusion of Persons with Disabilities across the Life Span – that was the central theme of the 18th annual international conference, which took place in Pilsen from June 27 to July 1.

The IASE 2024 Conference was organized by the International Association of Special Education (IASE) in collaboration with the Special and Inclusive Education Unit at the Faculty of Education, University of West Bohemia in Pilsen. "We are greatly honored to have had the opportunity to organize such an important event. We believe that this conference will contribute to the development of special education and support international cooperation," said Pavel Mentlík, Dean of the Faculty.

Participants from 32 countries around the world also had the opportunity to visit several schools and Disabled people's organizations in Pilsen and its surroundings, providing delegates with an insight into practice in the Czech Republic. Excursions to schools and organizations took place the day before the official start of the conference, on June 27, with significant support from UWB students, who guided a total of eight groups of delegates and provided them with interpretation services.

The opening ceremony was held on Friday, June 28 at 3:00 PM. The Dean of the Faculty of Education and the Rector of UWB gave the opening speeches. There was also a cultural interlude featuring performances of both classical music and Czech folk songs by students from the Department of Music Education and Culture, as well as a

performance by the band Hazband from Zbuch.

Individual presentations were given on Saturday, Sunday, and Monday. The program included lectures, workshops, and panel discussions that provided space for exchanging experiences and establishing new professional contacts. "The aim of the conference was to create a diverse and welcoming platform for sharing research results and examples of good practice in the fields of special education and social work. One of the main goals of the conference was to support international cooperation in special education," said Šárka Káňová, the conference chair and head of the Special and Inclusive Education Unit.

In addition to lectures and round table discussions, participants could look forward to exhibitors from schools and non-profit organizations who presented their projects and activities. The conference also featured art exhibitions by young people with disabilities from the Czech Republic, Singapore, and the USA, such as "My Life" (students involved in the research project PEDAL), "I Hear in Color" (Martina Květová), "Years of the Demon, Spirit of the School" (Michael Bednář), "My Pilsen, My City" (students with intellectual disabilities), and the "Traveling Photo Exhibition of Children with Autism" (Ngo Procit).

The conference concluded with a gala evening on Monday, July 1, at the Měšťanská Beseda in Pilsen, where the Cimbálová muzika Trnka performed. The event also included an auction. with proceeds going to support schools with students with special educational needs. "Thanks for organizing the entire event goes to staff and students of the Department of Education but also to the Department of Music Education and Culture, the Department of Mathematics. **Physics** and **Technical** Education, the Center for Physical Education and Sports, and the Center for Lifelong and Distance Learning at UWB," concluded Pavel Mentlík.

Reflections

Reflecting on the Inclusion Collection: A Journey of Artistic Evolution from Minnesota to the Czech Republic

As the IASE conference concluded on July 1, Dr. Šárka Káňová, Dr. Masha Černíková, and I took a moment to reflect on the profound

impact of the Inclusion Collection. This exhibition, featuring works from Minnesota to the Czech Republic, highlighted the rich diversity and depth of the artists' experiences.

Our journey began with the installation of the "My Life" exhibit at Café Restaurant Kačaba, a central hub in Pilsen that serves not only as a café but also as a rehabilitation program cofounded by Dr. Káňová. This exhibit was particularly meaningful for her, bringing the work of international and local transition students to her home city. The multi-medium pieces, created by five transition students from Minnesota schools, vividly depicted their real-life experiences during transitional phases. The exhibit was simultaneously displayed at the University of West Bohemia, ensuring its presence throughout the conference.

The conference's visual identity, featuring a striking depiction of Pilsen's cityscape, set a vibrant tone for the event. A field trip from the spring with young artists to documented landmarks like The Great Synagogue and the statue of Spejbl and Hurvínek looking out onto Republic Square. Dr. Káňová carefully installed these works onto stained-painted

canvases, which will now grace the new offices of the Faculty of Education on campus of the University of West Bohemia.

Working alongside Dr. Masha Černíková, an artist deeply committed to inclusive art, was a highlight. One particularly moving moment was meeting the large family of Martina Květová, a young artist who began her creative journey in March 2022. Her vibrant acrylic paintings, inspired by music and created to her own rhythm, invite viewers into her imaginative world.

Another standout artist was Michal Bednář, who participated in the first rendition of "My Life" in 2023 and showcased his first solo exhibition at the conference this year. His work, reminiscent of professional street art, is raw, gritty, and beautiful. Through drawings, paintings, texts, and collages, Michal narrates his artistic and personal growth, with his dedication to ceramics and literary endeavors evident in every piece.

The *Inclusion Collection* has not only showcased diverse artistic expressions across



borders but also underscored the global impact of inclusive art practices. As we look back on the conference and the exhibitions, it is clear that these artistic journeys have fostered crosscultural connections and deepened our understanding of creative evolution. We eagerly anticipate future collaborations and continued dialogue in the realm of artistic inclusion.

They will be taken home by a stunning delegate from Singapore who will tell them about the blind children of Kharkiv. And I'll bring back a little bit of the warmth and international support I've received here."

We have a quorum. President Ticha explained the voting process. Reports will be given orally but approval will be from any member present.

Guests: Approximately 25 people besides the Board members were present at the meeting.

The meeting was held, in person, as part of the 18th Biennial IASE Conference.

Meeting called to order at 17:11 p.m. by President Renata Ticha.

The Minutes of the 2022 General Membership Meeting in Vietnam were available for review. Anne Crylen moved and Zandile Nkabinde seconded the minutes.

MEMBERSHIP: Report moved by Daniel and seconded by Zandile.

Rachael reported that we currently have 350 members representing 38 countries.;11 libraries and a number of new members from Czech Republic as a result of the conference. She encouraged members to sponsor those from developing countries for an additional \$20 to their membership. She sends out email reminders when your membership is due and encourages members to respond right away. Mary Gale Budzisz recognized Rachael for her work on getting the rolling membership process going.

There was a question from the audience about the Conference Proceedings. Renata said that Brit Ferguson worked hard as editor and there are over 60 proceedings. The

proceedings were sent out to members prior to the conference.

NEWSLETTER:

Iris introduced the new newsletter editor, Dr. Samantha Riggleman of St. Joseph University (Philadelphia). They will work together to get the next edition out during the transition.

GIVING/VOLUNTEER SERVICE: Report was moved by Zandile and seconded by Daniel.

Iris stated that we currently have 11 VSP sites in 7 countries, 1 approved site (in Tanzania) is pending a visit by a member. 3 sites have been moved to Sustainable; SEKOMU (Tanzania), Ho Chi Minh City University (Vietnam), and Santa Maria Clinic (Vietnam). Craig Goldsberry was introduced as the Vietnam site Representative. Moses Walusimbi was introduced as the director of the new site in Uganda.

NATIONAL CHAIRS: Report moved by Daniel and seconded by Zandile. Carolyn reported that there are currently 10 Active National Chairs. Some National Chairs participated in the Virtual Dialogues. There will be a session for National Chairs today. The new coordinator of National Chairs will be Samantha Mrstik starting in January.

Currently we are working on updating the website and streamlining the navigation as the website host has migrated the site twice in the last few years resulting in redundancies and broken links. In the last two years the conference pages have been updated with information about the last conference in Vietnam and information about the conference in 2024 in Pilsen. in members being able to receive updates via email.

EVALUATION RESULTS 18th BIENNIAL CONFERENCE DR. BRENDA LAZARUS, IASE SECRETARY

At the closing session of the IASE 18th Biennial Conference in Pilsen, Czech Republic, attendees had an opportunity to complete an electronic conference evaluation. Thirty nine delegates completed the evaluation. Overall, 64.1% said they were Very Satisfied and 35.9% were Satisfied with the conference. Delegates were Very Satisfied (69.2 %) with the conference facilities; 76.9% were Very Satisfied with the registration process. Twelve of the respondents (35.1%) attended the Pre Conference Site Visits and 23 (62.2%) did not attend.

The Conference Site visits were held before the conference for the first time as the schools in Pilsen were closing for summer holidays the next day. (Note: Many delegates attended the site visits who did not complete the evaluation.)

Overall, attendees were Very Satisfied (74.4%) with the Friday Opening Session. 56.4% were Very Satisfied with with the lunches and breaks although several wished there had been more vegetarian options. The Closing Gala ranked Very Satisfied (64.1%) by the respondents. Attendees ranked Network opportunities Very Satisfied (71.4%). The Keynote Speakers were ranked Satisfied by between 61.5%-79.5%. Twenty eight of the respondents learned of the conference because

they are IASE members, 5 people found the conference on the IASE website and 6 listed "other" as their source of conference awareness.

We thank the attendees from the USA, India, Vietnam, Australia, Indonesia, Canada, Czech Republic, Singapore and the Ukraine for taking the time to complete the evaluation. 69.2% of the respondents indicated an interest in volunteering for the next conference or for being on one of the Board committees.

We received many good suggestions for our next conference. These have been shared with the pertinent Board Members.

If you attended the conference and did not have a chance to complete the evaluation, but would like to be involved with the Board committees or help with the next conference in Bhutan, please reach out to one of the Board Members with your interest. We hope to see you in Bhutan for the IASE 19th Biennial conference in Summer 2026.
