Renáta Tichá, Ph.D., received her Ph.D. in Special Education at the University of Minnesota in 2008. She has extensive experience in development, implementation, and conducting research with individuals with intellectual and developmental, and related disabilities. She has been a principal investigator or co-PI on multiple grants, including randomized control trials (RCT) with adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities in community residential settings and investigating the effectiveness of a workforce intervention for frontline supervisors working in agencies serving people with IDD or aging needs. Dr. Tichá is a PI on the National Core Indicators Survey study to assist with answering questions pertaining to the quality of life for adults with IDD, including rights, choice, and employment. She is a Co-Director of the Global Resource Center on Inclusive Education (GRC), working on international projects in Japan, Bhutan, India, Armenia, and other countries focused on inclusion in education, employment as well as social inclusion. Dr. Tichá is an editor of the *Journal of the International Association of Special Education (JIASE)*.

A TRIBUTE MR. DARLINGTON CHANGARA (IASE National Chair for Zimbabwe)



On December 24th, 2021, the IASE community lost a dear friend and colleague, Mr. Darlington Changara, who was IASE Chair for Zimbabwe since 2013. Darlington was the director of Midlands AIDS Caring Organization (MACO), an organization working with vulnerable children, mainly orphans. Darlington's brainchild, MACO, provided training to schoolteachers to build their capacity to meet the emotional and psychosocial support needs of the many vulnerable children in his native Zimbabwe. Through his research and community development initiatives, he made significant contributions to community health and education—most notably, advocacy for compassionate community responses to the most vulnerable in the community. Darlington was a true visionary, a community health leader whose contributions towards building HIV/AIDS awareness, prevention, and community support in Zimbabwe will continue to make a difference throughout the country and region.

His passion and dedication to children with special needs can best be summarized in his own words, *"My vision for special education is a stigma-free education which allows students with special education needs having equal treatment and opportunities in the world."* Darlington may be gone, but his legacy will live on, and his vision will continue to make a difference in the lives of many vulnerable members of the community. Title of Proposal:

Culturally-sensitive and trauma-informed education practices

Abstract:

Students bring their whole selves into the classroom. We can best serve students when we address their whole being, including their multicultural backgrounds and psychosocial contexts. Understanding students' contexts include acknowledgment of their traumas, whether historical, transgenerational, interpersonal, or systems-based. Our cultivation of such awareness is necessary to foster student growth and inclusivity. By doing so, we may tailor our lessons and our communication modes to better meet individual and collective student needs. Through culturally-sensitive and trauma-informed education practices, we may extinguish the potential of our schools and classrooms perpetuating systems of oppression and marginalization.

This presentation aims to increase understanding of: (1a) the impacts of trauma as well as cultural and multiple marginalization on student learning, (1b) how to recognize subtle cues of how such impacts may be recognized in the classroom; (2a) theoretical models of multicultural orientations and trauma-informed practices, (2b) applications of such practices in the classroom.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Dr. Erlinda P. Borrromeo



Erlinda P. Borrromeo is a grandmother of a child with autism. She is no stranger to the pain and disillusionment that family members go through on discovering that they have a child with autism—a lifelong condition characterized by deficits in communication, social skills, and challenging behaviors, among others.

Eager to share her wealth of knowledge and experience with families in the Philippines, Dr. Borrromeo went further to conceive and co-found the Autism Hearts Foundation (AHF) which she serves as its president. A non-profit organization headquartered in San Francisco with a Philippine office, AHF hopes to maximize the potential of persons with ASD, help them learn, develop, function independently and participate in a full range of social, cultural, and quality of life activities, becoming responsive and productive members of society. While leading the efforts to develop state-of-the-art programs and services at AHF, Lynda simultaneously pursued her Master's Degree in Special Education with an emphasis in Mild-Moderate Disabilities focusing on Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) at the San Francisco State University. And A Doctorate Degree in Management & Organizational Leadership at the University of Phoenix.

Dr. Borrromeo's successful and current global autism advocacy involvement and experiences with United Nations (New York), World Health Organization (WHO, Geneva), and Autism Speaks (New York), brings to her global partners the aspirations of autism-challenged Filipino families for "better lives", while bringing back to the

families the current knowledge, education and research, state-of-the-art diagnosis, treatment and therapies, programs, services and resources stemming from these global partnerships. Thus, Leading, Empowering, and Inspiring Individuals with Autism to reach their highest potentials.

MEET THE NEW PRESIDENT-ELECT

Dr. Gulnoza Yakubova



Gulnoza Yakubova, Ph.D., is an Assistant Professor in Special Education in the College of Education at the University of Maryland, College Park. Having received her Ph.D. in special education from Purdue University in 2013, Dr. Yakubova worked as an Assistant Professor at Duquesne University prior to joining the University of Maryland.

Dr. Yakubova's overarching research interest focuses on examining technology-based interventions to teach autistic students the skills they need to have a successful life after school. She uses technology with a primary focus on: (1) increasing functional independence of autistic children in school and community, (2) supporting access to learning academic content, with a focus on mathematics skills for students who traditionally have received functional skills curriculum, and (3) training parents on creating video-based interventions using daily use technology and implementing video-based interventions to teach functional and independent living skills to their children at home.

She has taught undergraduate and graduate courses in inclusive and secondary education practices, single-case research methodology, universal design for learning, and education of students diagnosed with autism, instruction of students with physical disabilities, and evidence-based practices.
